A warm welcome aboard to everyone arrived here today for the 39th annual day celebrations of **B.V Reddy Senior Secondary School**.

I deem it a great honour and much privilege to present before you the school annual report and compendium for the academic year **2024 - 2025**.

ACADEMICS CREDENTIALS:

The Highlights of this evening is the students of class XII and X have scored remarkable execution of hard work with laudable 100 % results in CBSE BOARD EXAMINATION 2024.

Achieving academic excellence is at the heart of the endeavour of all educators and academic institutions. An important measure of this pursuit is how the institution has performed, the most important of which is the examinations conducted by the CBSE. We are proud to acknowledge that we have good result achievement in academics and extracurricular activities throughout the session. We are happy to share the glad news that the 2nd batch of class XII and the 31st batch of class X appeared for the 2023 - 2024 board examinations and achieved it with flying colours.

14 students appeared for the All India Senior Secondary Examination 2024.

MONISH gets the highest percentage of 92% aggregate.

98 students appeared for the secondary examination. Kavya Sai gets the highest percentage of 94% aggregate.

EXPENDITURE:

1. To ensure that students can travel to and from school comfortably and securely, a **new bus** was purchased at a cost of ₹ 31,49,000
2. To enhance security and to ensure the safety of students, staff & school property, high-quality **surveillance equipment** costing ₹ 7,79,500 were installed across key areas of the campus
3. To ensure reliable and sustainable water supply for the school **new bore well** was installed at a cost of ₹ 2, 80, 000.
4. To integrate modern technology into everyday teaching & to facilitate dynamic, engaging lessons, support multimedia content & encourage students' interaction three **smart classroom digital boards** were purchased at a cost of ₹ 4, 20, 000.
5. In order to provide students with the tools and resources necessary both the **computer lab** and **robotics lab** were **renovated** to ensure that students are proficient in the latest learning tools.

JEE/NEET:

MEDICAL CAMP:
